In addition to the new blogging capability, Nokia Lifeblog 1.5 comes with some usability additions. The ability to back-up to CD or DVD, a full screen item view, and enhanced sharing on the mobile, makes it more enjoyable to browse, search, and share your life memories in Nokia Lifeblog.

Nokia Lifeblog 1.5 will be compatible with the Nokia 6670 phone, and later on with other selected Nokia Series 60 phones. Nokia Lifeblog 1.5 will be available in 15 languages. The latest languages include Czech, Danish, Dutch, Greek, Hungarian, Norwegian, Polish and Swedish.
