SUPPORT GUIDE FOR E-MAIL SETTINGS IN NOKIA 6800



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1. INTRODUCTION

To use the e-mail function on your phone, you need an e-mail account and two types of settings in your phone: 1) Service settings that contain the access point settings for e-mail and 2) E-mail settings. Firstly, set the service settings, secondly, select the access point that you want to use, and, finally, key in the e-mail settings. For more information, see your phone's user's guide.

2. SERVICE SETTINGS FOR E-MAIL

Press Menu and select *Services, Settings, Connection settings*. Select the first free set and press Activate. Then select *Edit active service settings*. For the availability of the service settings, contact your network operator or service provider.

Setting	Explanation
Settings' name	The name of the connection set. Max. 20 characters. You can use any name.
Homepage	Not needed
Session mode	Select Permanent or Temporary.
Connection security	Select On or Off.
Data bearer	Select GSM data or GPRS. If you select GSM data, the settings are listed in 2.1. If you select GPRS, the settings are listed in 2.2.

2.1 GSM DATA BEARER SETTINGS

Bearer settings: Use GSM data when your e-mail service provider requires dial-up access and gives you a specific phone number.

Setting	Explanation
Dial-up number	Local or international phone number
IP address	Not needed
Authentication type	Select Normal.
Data call type	Select <i>Analogue</i> or <i>ISDN</i> (v.110) depending on the network and modem. Check with your Internet access provider.
Data call speed	Select 9600/14 400
Login type	Select <i>Manual</i> or <i>Automatic</i> depending on the access point in use. Check with your network operator or service provider.
User name	Key in the user name, max. 32 characters.
Password	Key in the password, max. 32 characters.

Display terminal window S	Select Yes to do manual user authentication for intranet connections.
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2.2 GPRS BEARER SETTINGS

Bearer settings: Use GPRS if your e-mail service provider allows access through GPRS connection provided by the network operator.

Setting	Explanation
GPRS access point	Key in the access point name
IP address	Not needed.
Authentication type	Select Normal.
Login type	Select <i>Manual</i> or <i>Automatic</i> depending on the access point in use. Check with your network operator or service provider.
User name	Key in the user name, max. 32 characters.
Password	Key in the password, max. 32 characters.

Note that you may need different service settings for WAP and e-mail. Some e-mail service providers may not allow access to your e-mail via a different service provider's server.

Next you have to define e-mail settings.

2.3 ACCESS POINT SETTINGS

Press Menu and select Messages, E-mail, Service settings.

Settings Explanation	
Application	Activates the e-mail service settings for the e-mail application.
Default	Select <i>Default</i> , if your e-mail uses the same settings as currently selected for the WAP browser.

3. E-MAIL SETTINGS

Press Menu and select *Messages, E-mail, Open, Settings, Mailbox in use.* Select the mailbox that you want to edit and select *Edit active mailbox.*

Setting	Explanation	Where to find or obtain
Mailbox name	The name for the mailbox.	You can use any name.
E-mail address	Your e-mail address	E-mail service provider
My name	Name or nickname, if you want the recipient see it.	Use any name.
Outgoing (SMTP) server	E-mail server address	E-mail service provider
Outgoing (SMTP) port	SMTP port number for outgoing e-mails (common value is 25)	E-mail service provider
Use SMTP authorisation	Set to Yes, if the e-mail service provider requires authentication for sending e-mails.	E-mail service provider
SMTP user name	User name for outgoing e-mails	E-mail service provider
SMTP password	Password for outgoing e-mails	E-mail service provider
Include signature	Personal signature that is automatically added to the end of the e-mail	You can define it.
Incoming (POP3/IMAP) server	E-mail server address for the incoming e-mail.	E-mail service provider
Incoming (POP3/IMAP) port	Port number: 110 for POP3 and 143 for IMAP	E-mail service provider
POP3/IMAP user name	User name to access the mailbox.	E-mail service provider
POP3/IMAP password	Password to access the mailbox.	E-mail service provider
Reply-to address	Another e-mail address for your incoming e-mails that differs from the one defined in <i>E-mail address</i> .	You can define it.

Incoming server type	Either POP3 or IMAP4. If both types are supported, select IMAP4. Changing the server type also changes the incoming port number.	E-mail service provider
Secure login APOP	For <i>POP3</i> only: <i>On</i> for the connection requiring an encrypted login, otherwise <i>Off.</i> *	E-mail service provider
Retrieve mails	Can be set between 1 and 50 to retrieve desired number of email messages.	You can define it.

^{*} Using encrypted login enables increased security for user names and passwords. It does not increase security for the connection itself.

You should now be able to send and receive e-mail messages with your Nokia 6800 Messaging Phone.
