
Quick Guide for Using the Calendar Application to Import and Export Calendar Notes between Your Phone and Microsoft Outlook 97/98 or Microsoft Schedule+ (versions 7.5, 7.0 and 7.0a)


IMPORT

Please first ensure that your phone is connected into the PC with the cable. Click the Calendar icon from the Nokia Data Suite bar.

Next open the Calendar menu and select the <u>PC-Calendar</u> program you require and then Import.

In the Import Period box, select the period from which to import calendar notes.






If your Microsoft Outlook 97/98 or Microsoft Schedule+ application is closed, you'll get a message as shown on the left. You can choose either <u>Connect</u> or <u>Work Offline</u>; if you click the latter it doesn't start to run the program.

Note that you can import and export only Reminders and Meetings!



The Calendar application begins to load notes from the PC calendar. After that you can select which ones you want to import. Click OK.

If you have a reminder in a note this will also come along.




The program confirms how many notes you have imported.




EXPORT


If you had added new calendar events to the phone while the phone was not connected to the PC, you can update the list of calendar events in the Calendar main view by clicking Refresh in the View menu.



Select the event and then <u>export</u> it into the PC calendar.



Next, you get a confirmation for exporting.



In your PC Calendar application, e.g. Microsoft Outlook 97/98 (or Microsoft Schedule+), the exported appointment can look like this. In this example, there is also a reminder which has been set 15 minutes before the event.
