1. INTRODUCTION

This guide briefly describes how to install and start using Nokia PC Suite. For more detailed information on the use of PC Suite, please refer to the online Help in the PC Suite applications.

Nokia PC Suite consists of the following applications:

- Nokia Content Copier lets you copy data between two Nokia phones, back up data on your Nokia phone to a compatible PC, and erase data from the phone
- Nokia PC WAP Manager helps you manage your WAP bookmarks and connection sets
- Nokia Phone Editor enables you to manage various phone functions conveniently from your PC
- Nokia PC Sync allows you to synchronize contacts and calendar items between your phone and your PC Personal Information Manager
- Nokia PC Graphics lets you draw and edit caller group logos, picture messages and operator logos
- Nokia PC Composer allows you to create new ringing tones for your phone
- Nokia Connection Manager allows you to choose the connection type used when connecting your PC and your phone.
- Nokia Application Installer allows you to install Java[™] applications from your PC to the phone.

2. SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

To install and run PC Suite, you need:

- An Intel-compatible PC with a Pentium II processor (400 MHz)
- 64 MB of RAM
- Windows 98/Me/2000/XP
- At least 50 MB of free disk space.

To use online helps with the PC Suite, you need:

Internet Explorer 4.0 or newer.

For a connection between the Nokia 6310i and the PC, you need at least one of the following connection sets:

 An infrared port in your computer. Infrared connection is available for Windows 98/Me/2000/XP only.

- The DLR-3P connection cable
- A Bluetooth enabled PC and a compatible Bluetooth connectivity solution or a compatible PC with an internal Bluetooth connectivity to give you access from your PC to Bluetooth devices, for example one of the following:
 - PCs with internal Bluetooth connectivity:
 - Toshiba Tecra 9000
 - IBM ThinkPad A30p
 - Bluetooth adaptors (to be used with compatible, Bluetooth enabled PCs):
 - TDK USB Bluetooth module
 - 3COM Bluetooth PCCard (3CRWB6096)
 - Xircom CreditCard (CBT)
 - Brainbox USB Bluetooth adaptor
 - Digianswer Bluetooth Software Nokia PC Suite
- **Note:** There may be restrictions on using Bluetooth devices. Check with your local authorities.

Note:

In this guide, all references to a PC (Personal Computer) apply equally to a laptop computer.

3. INSTALLING PC SUITE

- 1. Exit all Windows programs.
- 2. From the CD-ROM main menu, click Install Software and then click Nokia PC Suite 4.88.
- 3. Follow the instructions on the screen, and note:
 - In the Select Components window, the Setup program prompts you to select the
 applications you want to install: you can either install all six applications or just the
 ones you want. Nokia Connection Manager is always installed regardless of your
 choice.
 - In the Language Selection window, select the language for PC Suite. You can select only one language, and this language will be used in all the installed PC Suite applications.
 - In the **Connection Method Selection** window, select one or more of the available connection methods: cable, infrared, or a Bluetooth connection. After selecting the connection method(s), the Setup program prompts you to connect your phone to the PC by using the selected connection method(s).

4. GETTING STARTED

4.1 STARTING A PC SUITE APPLICATION

You can start PC Suite applications from the Start menu: click the **Start** button, point to **Programs** and **Nokia PC Suite 4**, and then click the application you want.



Note: You cannot make data or fax calls with your phone while any of the Nokia PC Suite applications are active. Also, you cannot use Nokia PC Suite applications while you have active data or fax calls.

When Nokia PC Sync is running, the Nokia PC Sync icon appears on the taskbar. You can access the Nokia PC Sync menu commands by right-clicking this icon.



Tip: You can set Nokia PC Sync to start automatically on startup. To do this, right-click the Nokia PC Sync icon on the taskbar and select **Enable on Startup**.

4.2 CREATING A NEW SYNCHRONIZATION TASK

To create a new synchronization task, click the **Start** button, point to **Programs** and **Nokia PC Suite 4**, and then click **New Synchronization**.

4.3 CONNECTING YOUR PHONE TO A PC

To be able to synchronize calendar items and contacts between your phone and a PC application, and to transfer group logos, picture messages, operator logos, ringing tones and WAP settings between your phone and a PC, you must connect the phone to the PC. You can use infrared, Bluetooth, or a cable connection. If you selected more than one connection method in the Setup program, you can choose which one to use with the Nokia Connection Manager. For more information, see the online Helps of the PC Suite applications.

4.4 USING NOKIA CONTENT COPIER

You can use Nokia Content Copier to copy data between two Nokia phones, back up data on your Nokia phone to a compatible PC, and erase data from the phone.

To start Nokia Content Copier, click the **Start** button, point to **Programs** and **Nokia PC Suite 4**, and then click **Nokia Content Copier**. Follow the instructions on the screen.

Nokia Content Copier supports several Nokia phones. The table below lists the supported phones and the connection types available for different phone models:

Nokia 6250/Nokia 7110	Infrared connection/the DLR-3P serial cable
Nokia 8210/Nokia 8310/Nokia 8850/Nokia 8890	Infrared connection
Nokia 6210/Nokia 6310/Nokia 6310i	Bluetooth connection/infrared connection/the DLR-3P serial cable

For information on connecting your phone to a PC via a serial cable, see the user's guide of the phone.

4.5 CHANGING THE LANGUAGE

The language selection is made in the Setup program. You can select only one language, and this language will be used in all the installed PC Suite applications. To change the language, you need to reinstall PC Suite.

5. UNINSTALLING PC SUITE

- 1. Click the **Start** button, point to **Settings** and click **Control Panel**.
- 2. Double-click Add/Remove Programs.
- 3. In the Install/Uninstall tab, select **Nokia PC Suite 4.88** from the list of software that can be removed.
- 4. Click Add/Remove.
- 5. In the Nokia PC Suite Setup view, click **Remove** and then click **Next**.
- 6. Follow the instructions on the screen until the program files are removed.



Important safety notes

All the safety instructions in the user's guides of your phone and computer also apply when this product is used with the phone.

Remember to make backup copies of all important data to protect against possible loss or alteration.

To disconnect the cable from the phone, hold the connector and remove the cable.

Do not point the infrared beam at anyone's eyes or allow it to interfere with other infrared devices.
